A mummy is the body of a person (or an animal) that has been preserved after death.

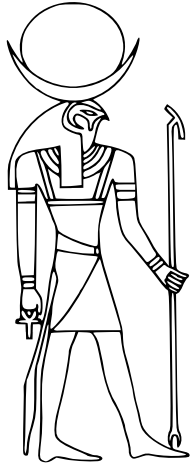

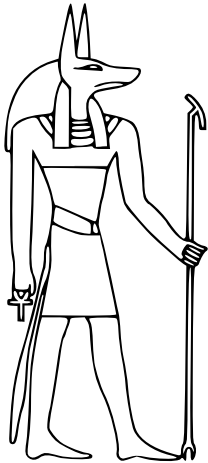
# Ra

Ra was the king of the deities and the father of all creation.



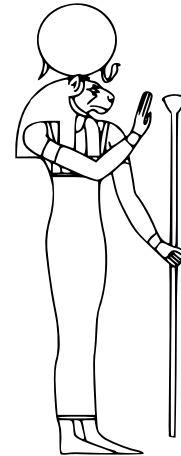
# Hathor

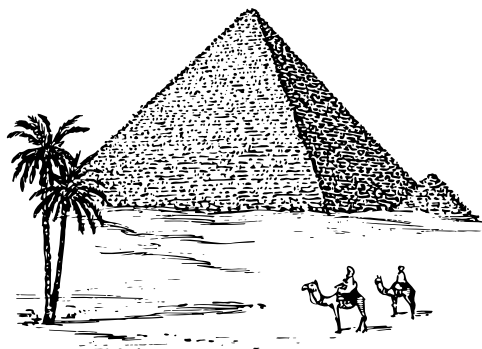
Anubis was a jackal-headed deity who presided over the embalming process and accompanied dead kings in the afterworld.



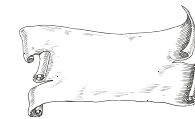
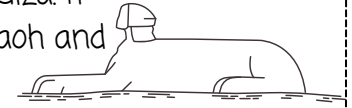
# Tefnut

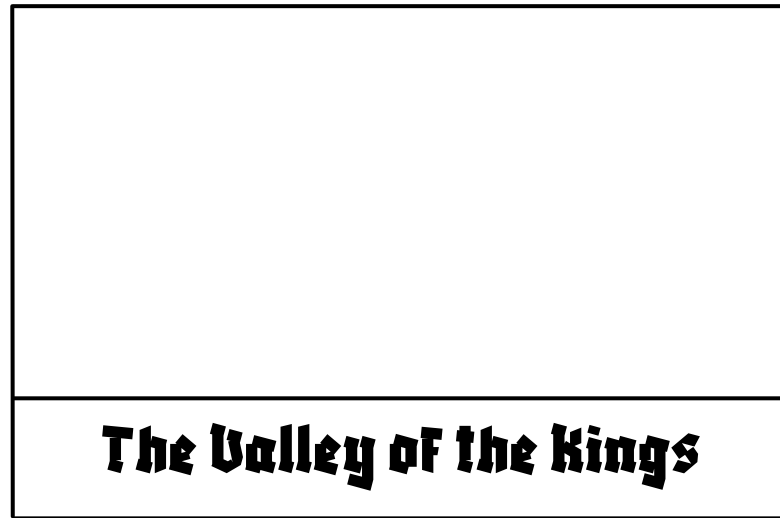
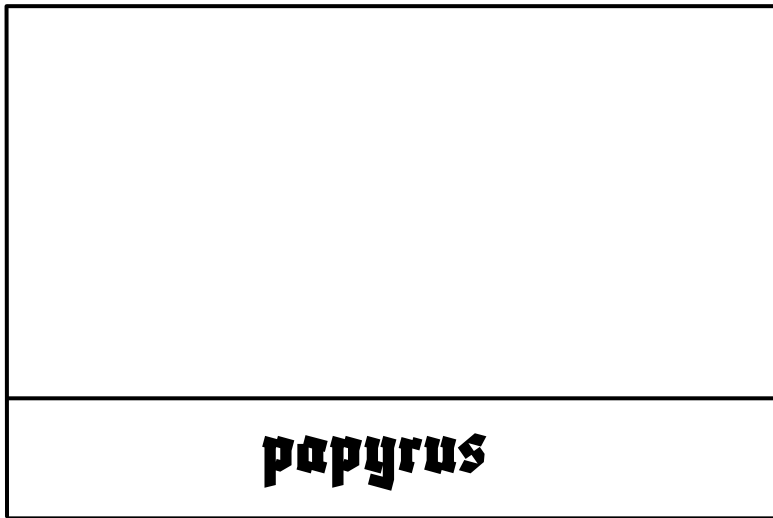
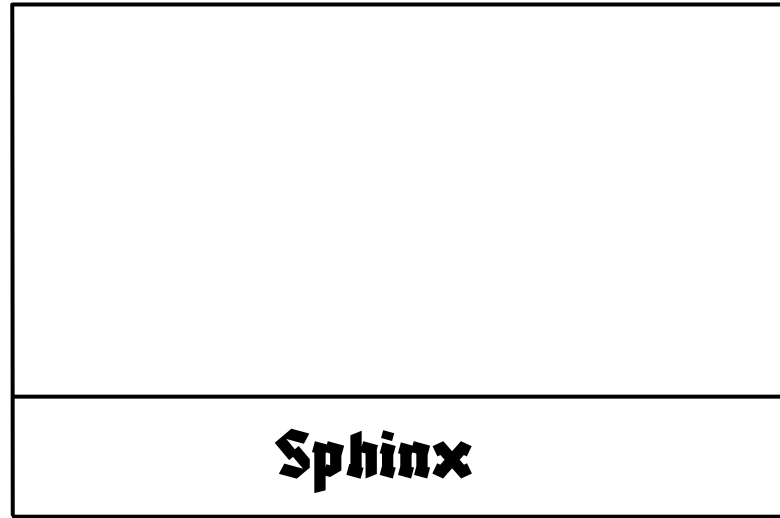
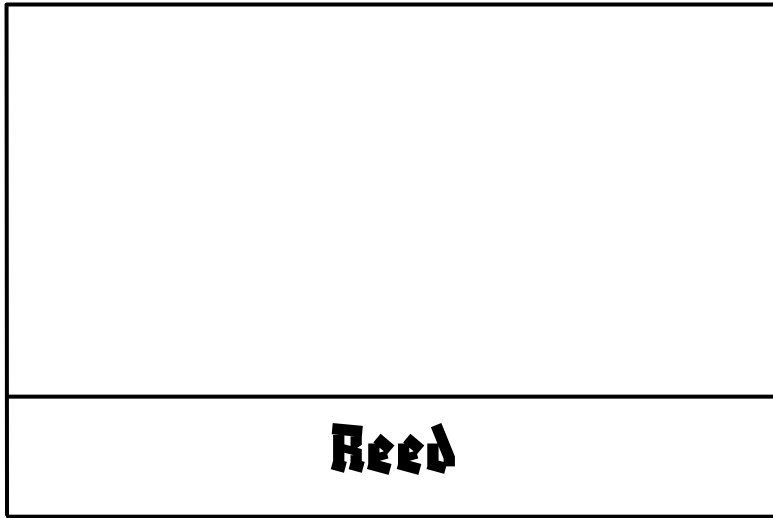
The ancient Egyptians used papyrus to make paper, baskets, sandals, mats, rope, blankets, tables, chairs, mattresses, medicine, perfume, food, and clothes.

The Ancient Egyptians built boats from papyrus reeds, which were widely cultivated along the Nile River and Delta. This reed was also used for many other purposes, especially for providing papyrus writing parchments.



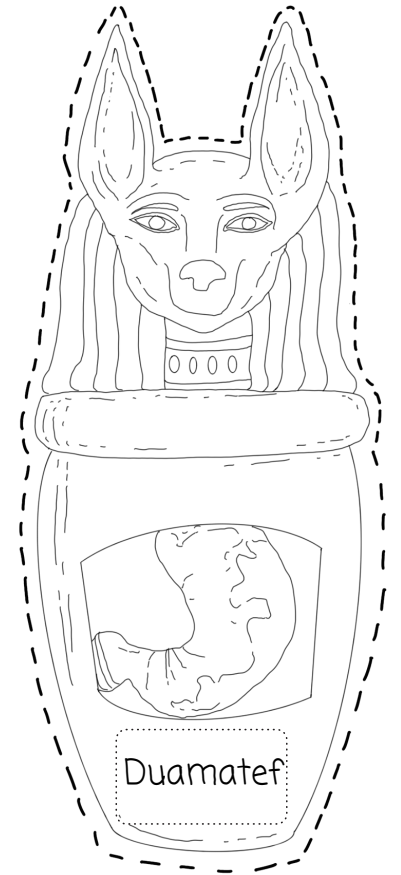
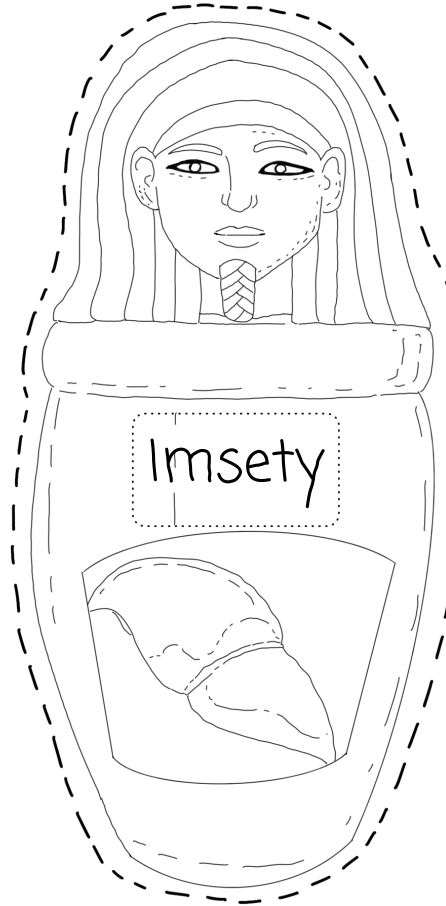
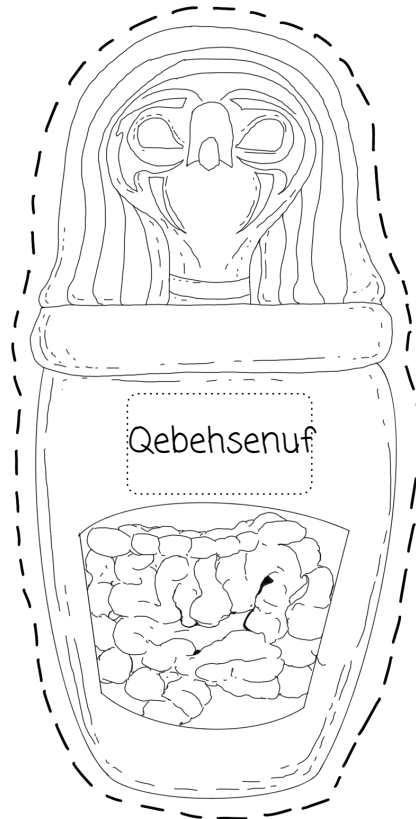
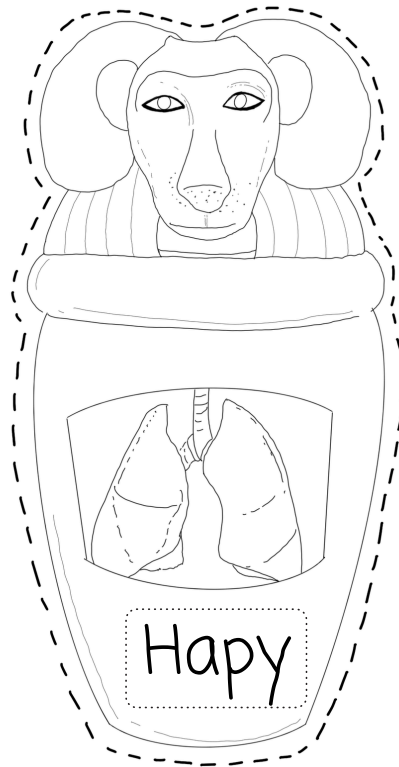

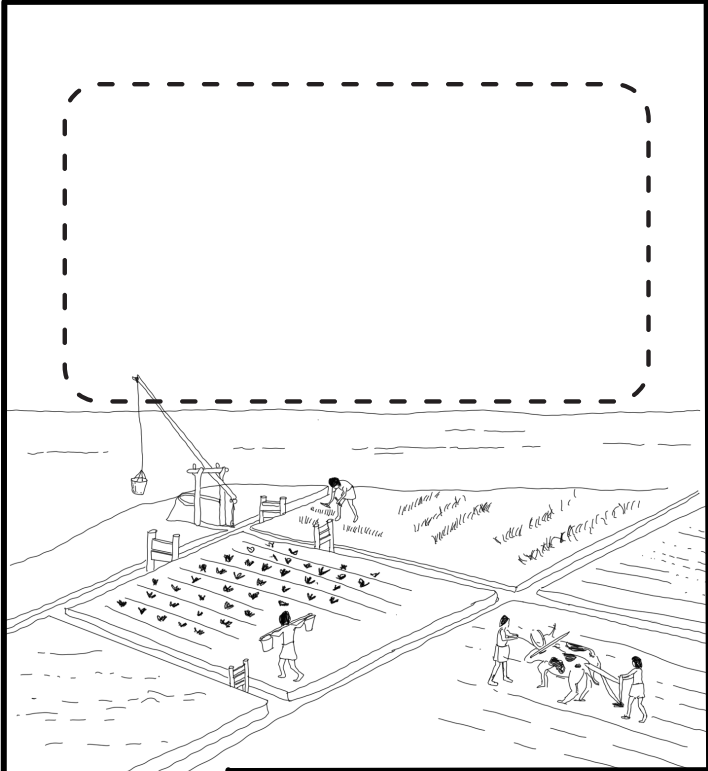
The Ancient Egyptians wore clothing made from linen. Linen is a light and cool fabric that worked well in the hot climate of Egypt.
